I thank you for all that you have done in the past few weeks to support your child with their learning. We appreciate that you are juggling your own demands as well as your child's and that this is a huge task. Please do not put pressure on yourselves, or your children, at the expense of your wellbeing. It is ok for you to decide not to complete all of the work on a set day or choosing those activities that you may be able to complete as a family. Please remember that we are here to support you and your family and whilst we know times are tough for many of our families that it is ok to ask for help.



Staff have been busy preparing for the challenges of remote learning and it has been great to receive feedback about the learning program. We endeavour to offer a variety of learning experiences during this time and we have made some changes to the program based on feedback we received. One of the challenges we face is that we are not able to meet everyone's needs perfectly. Whilst you may have an idea of what works best for your child we have to consider the big picture impact that changes/ suggestions may have.

The Specialist teachers are providing a range of activities each Friday which offer opportunities to participate in the specialist program and it has been great to see the work that the kids have been posting. These activities can be completed on Friday or throughout the week at a time that suits. The Performing Arts tasks are all our production songs and dances which we are going to be developing over the term and it has been great for me to learn how to easily draw a penguin using the Adam Wallace inspired Art. I know those that have been posted are being printed off and displayed at school on our Remote Learning gallery wall.

ON SITE ATTENDANCE

I have been advised by the Education Department to review and reduce the number of students and staff on-site due to Stage 4 restrictions.

Requests for onsite supervision must be made in writing using the approved Education Department application form. This form has now been updated to further restrict access to onsite supervision. The main change is a move away from 'essential workers' to 'permitted workers'. The Victorian Government has provided a list of these work areas.

Application forms must be received by the school by 3.00pm each Thursday and *all families who seek this service must complete an application which is* accompanied by a 'permitted worker' letter. A 'permitted worker' letter may be requested from your employer.
