PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

WELCOME BACK TO OUR STUDENTS!

It was with much excitement last Monday that we welcomed back all the children to onsite learning. While it was an option to stagger the return of the children across the week, we feel that every day is crucial and we needed the children back. A big thank you to everyone in our community (staff, students and parents) for all your efforts in working together for the best possible outcome for our children.

Overall, the return back has been incredibly smooth. The children were extremely excited to see each other and their teachers and the transition back has been successful.

We know remote and flexible learning has not always been easy, but through our collective efforts, our students have continued to make valuable progress in their learning. A smooth return to school is crucial as we aim to settle the

students back into a routine and back into the 'groove' and re-establish relationships.

As the term progresses, we will continue to have in place strong measures to protect the health and safety of students, staff, families and the community. This includes restricting parent access to school grounds and continued emphasis on hand hygiene and physical distancing where possible. All our high touch areas are being cleaned continuously throughout the day and I once again respectfully remind parents they should not enter the school buildings.

We thank the school community for adhering to the guidelines regarding drops offs and pickups, as well as movement in and around the school. It enables us to provide the safest possible environment during this time.

STAFFING AND GRADE STRUCTURES FOR 2021

As we are now planning for 2021 we ask any families that are not returning to Selby PS in 2021 to please let us know in writing (email preferred) as soon as possible.

If you know of any families that are looking to enrol their children in Selby PS for 2021 we ask them to contact the school as soon as possible and complete the enrolment forms.

2021 CLASS PLACEMENT REQUESTS

We are about to start the process of making plans for teacher and student placements for 2021. This is a complex process involving a range of factors and allocations. Student and teacher placements will not be finalised until late in the school year. Each year the staff work through a comprehensive process to form classes for the new year. Current teaching teams (including specialist teachers) develop prospective lists based on their knowledge of the students in relation to their academic, social/emotional and physical needs. We wish to offer parents an opportunity to provide, in writing, any special considerations in terms of any particular educational needs their child/ren may have, in line with school policy. Please be aware that we will consider all requests **but make no guarantees** that all requests will be met. <u>Please note that specific request for teachers will not be considered.</u> Any specific requests from parents in regards to the placement of their child/ren must be in writing and emailed to the office by no later than *Friday October 30th, 2020.* It is essential to have requests in by this date to assist with planning, staffing and organisation. Late requests will not be considered.

Each year the school conducts an opinion survey amongst a sample of the school community. This year, all families are invited to participate.

Results from this survey will be used to inform and direct our future school planning and improvement. All survey results are tabled, shared, discussed and analysed at School Council Meetings.

The survey can be completed on any internet enabled device (iPad, Desktop or Laptop, Smartphone) and is compatible with most browsers.

The survey will be open until Friday November 13, 2020. We have already had a number of families complete this survey and we look forward to getting as many responses as possible as this data is very valuable to us as we continually seek to improve Selby Primary School.



In Investigations they built a teddy village, made teddy baskets, decorated a special frame for a teddy photo, made a teddy headband and iced teddy bear biscuits. TERM 4 LEARNING OVERVIEWS

Prep

The Preps will commence the term with a fun week focused on their teddy's and a teddy bears' picnic.

In Investigations our focus will be Materials, their properties and sustainability. Their interests in relation to this will be built upon and developed through our literacy and numeracy focuses. We will firstly explore a variety of materials in the natural and built environment looking at where they come from, how they are made and used. We will continue our social and emotional learning through SWPBS and the Respectful Relationships lessons.

In Literacy students will begin writing with greater independence. They will be encouraged to use a writing checklist when writing a variety of texts including recounts, narratives and letters. We will continue to build on our knowledge of the alphabet and high frequency words using the Smart Spelling approach. Throughout the term students will build on their reading skills and strategies in activities involving the whole class and small groups.

In Numeracy students will continue to develop their knowledge and understanding of the place value of numbers beyond 10. They will build on their skills in addition, subtraction and sharing and begin exploring how to skip count. Using play based situations students will explore money and the measurement of: length, mass and capacity.

Japanese

This term Prep children will be introduced to writing their names in Japanese. They are learning this through fun activities such as making a name placemat, using playdough, a matching game, tracing and copying. The children will also be revisiting the activities that were posted during remote learning and going through them together with the grade.

Physical Education

Term 4 Physical Education will provide the opportunity for students to practise a number of fundamental movement skills such as tapping, throwing, catching and striking and participate in some outdoor games both with and without equipment.

Performing Arts

During Term 4 in Performing Arts, all students will continue learning and rehearsing their class dance routine for the school production the X-Factory. Drama skills and activities will also be practised to develop confidence and enhance performance skills.

Visual Arts

In Term 4 Visual Art, students will be studying Ancient Egyptian Art, exploring and learning about its history through a number of different mediums and techniques – painting, paper-mache, metallic foil embossing and plaster moulding.

Year 1/2

This term the Year 1/2 students will explore the whole school Inquiry focus of Courage through an integrated unit titled 'Under the Sea'. They will investigate and question how courageous people and living things show courage to explore new places and events. They will use this understanding to recognise how they can challenge themselves to experience and learn new things.

In English students will participate in whole class, small group and individual activities to develop both their Reading and Writing skills. Information Reports, Expositions (Persuasive) and Transactional texts will be studied this term. The students will continue to learn new spelling patterns and rules using the SMART Spelling Program.

In Mathematics students will commence each lesson with a quick automaticity task to increase their automatic recall of addition. They will continue to develop their knowledge and understanding of place value, addition, subtraction, multiplication, division and simple fractions. Collection of data from which graphs can be created to explore a question of interest and make observations will also be a focus this term.

Japanese

This term the Year 1/2 children will firstly be revisiting the activities that were posted during remote learning and going through them together with the grade. They will also be learning Japanese words for the body parts such as head, shoulders, knees, feet and some of the facial features. Activities will include flash cards, interactive games and making a body dice.

Physical Education

Term 4 Physical Education will provide the opportunity for students to practise a number of fundamental movement skills such as tapping, throwing, catching and striking and participate in some outdoor games both with and without equipment.

Performing Arts

During Term 4 in Performing Arts, all students will continue learning and rehearsing their class dance routine for the school production the X-Factory. Drama skills and activities will also be practised to develop confidence and enhance performance skills.

Visual Arts

In Term 4 Visual Art, students will be studying Ancient Egyptian Art, exploring and learning about its history through a number of different mediums and techniques – painting, paper-mache, metallic foil embossing and plaster moulding.



TERM 4 LEARNING OVERVIEWS

Year 3/4

Literacy sessions are held daily, with students given work that is catered for students individual needs. Guided reading sessions will be linked to our Inquiry Learning Subject Focus as well as a range of other areas to further develop students skills. Group tasks will focus on developing the student's level of reading comprehension. Students will have the opportunity to participate in different reading groups with rotations varying between working within their own class and working with the other 3/4 classes.

In writing this term there will be a focus on recounts and poetry. These topics will be broken into their individual components to develop a thorough understanding of the text structures. Our spelling program will focus on a weekly sound, blend or rule with various activities based on reinforcing/learning their individual weekly spelling words.

In our Mathematics sessions we will have a strong focus on the fundamentals of addition, subtraction, multiplication and division as these skills are essential for all other areas in maths. Time will be spent each day practicing Times Tables and other mental maths strategies.

Our Inquiry Unit is focussed on History and examines Australia both pre and post colonisation. Students will learn how Indigenous Australians lived before settlement and the impact that settlement has had on their way of life, convicts, The First Fleet, Explorers and how settlement occurred throughout the 1800s.

Japanese

This term the Year 3/4 students will firstly be revisiting the activities that were posted during remote learning and going through them together with the grade. They will also be learning about children's "Obento" (Japanese packed lunch) and some eating customs in Japan. Later this term children are going to make a simple Japanese style packed lunch in the class.

Physical Education

Students will have the opportunity to learn, practise and develop specialised movement skills such as throwing, catching, the strike (hitting) and running through the sports of volleyball, softball and Hot Shots (modified) tennis.

Performing Arts

During Term 4 in Performing Arts, all students will continue learning and rehearsing their class dance routine for the school production the X-Factory. Drama skills and activities will also be practised to develop confidence and enhance performance skills. The History of Music and music from different cultures will also be explored to learn the value and power of music and develop an aesthetic knowledge of music traditions.

Visual Arts

In Term 4 Visual Art, students will be studying Ancient Egyptian Art, exploring and learning about its history through a number of different mediums and techniques – painting, paper-mache, metallic foil embossing and plaster moulding.

Year 5/6

This term we will be learning about texts that persuade, entertain and inform. The Year 5s will be using their persuasive writing skills in their speeches for Captain roles for 2021. The Year 6s will be writing and practicing their Graduation Speeches. Our grammar focus will be on different parts of sentences, and we will continue to study spelling combinations in our SMART spelling sessions.

In Mathematics this term we are consolidating students' prior knowledge in shape, division, fractions, decimals, percentages, chance, BODMAS and patterns. We will be utilising real-life examples to demonstrate the relevance of these topics, so that students understand the reason behind and the usefulness of the skills being taught.

In Term 4 we are finishing our previous Multicultural unit before moving on to mini-units on Science and Economics.

Japanese

This term the Year 5/6 children will firstly be revisiting the activities that were posted during remote learning and going through them together with the grade. In each lesson, we will re-establish the Japanese room routines and reinforce the fundamental language such as greetings and classroom instructions led by Japanese class monitors. They will also be working on a "Japan Project". Each group of students will do research on one small aspect of Japanese culture and present them to the grade.

Physical Education

Students will have the opportunity to learn, practise and develop specialised movement skills such as throwing, catching, the strike (hitting) and running through the sports of volleyball, softball and Hot Shots (modified) tennis.

Performing Arts

During Term 4 in Performing Arts, all students will continue learning and rehearsing their class dance routine for the school production the X-Factory. Drama skills and activities will also be practised to develop confidence and enhance performance skills. The History of Music and music from different cultures will also be explored to learn the value and power of music and develop an aesthetic knowledge of music traditions.

Visual Arts

In Term 4 Visual Art, students will be studying Ancient Egyptian Art, exploring and learning about its history through a number of different mediums and techniques – painting, paper-mache, metallic foil embossing and plaster moulding.
