STUDENT ENROLMENT 2022

I would like to thank those families who have already enrolled their child for next year. If you have a child starting Prep please ensure you have completed their enrolment form as soon as possible. Additionally, if you know of a family in our local area who plan to send their child to Selby in 2022, please encourage them to enrol immediately.

NAPLAN TESTING

The next round of the annual National Assessment Program in Literacy and Numeracy (NAPLAN) tests will be conducted in May 2021. The NAPLAN tests will involve all students in years 3, 5, 7 and 9 from all states and territories across Government, Catholic and Independent Schools. The NAPLAN tests will be conducted on Tuesday May 11, Wednesday May 12 and Thursday May 13.

NAPLAN assesses skills in Literacy and Numeracy that are developed over time, through the school curriculum. NAPLAN is not a pass or fail type test, but rather shows how students are progressing in Numeracy and Literacy skills against national standards for all Australia children. It also provides valuable information that allows schools and governments to better target effort and support to help all students achieve their potential and acquire the basic skills to help them build successful and happy lives.

NAPLAN tests fundamental skills rather than specific content, and as such is not a test for which students can study or train for. The best way you can help your child prepare for NAPLAN is to let them know that NAPLAN is just one part of their school program, and to urge them to simply do the best they can on the day.

The data from the NAPLAN tests can provide the school with important information about each child's point of need and any gaps in their learning. It also provides a snapshot of where we are at as a school, which we then use to refine our whole school approaches. We appreciate the participation of your child and encourage families to ensure that students are at school for all NAPLAN tests.

An individual student NAPLAN report will be issued by the school later this year. Parents can use this information to monitor how their child is progressing and to identify any areas of concern. Parents may also wish to use their child's results to discuss progress with teachers. More information is available at www.naplan.edu.au

ATTITUDES TO SCHOOL STUDENT SURVEY

This term students from Year 4–6 will complete the annual Attitudes to School Survey. The survey assists schools to gain an understanding of students' perceptions and experience of school. Our school will use the survey results to plan programs and activities to improve your child's schooling experience.

Your child will complete the survey online during school hours using a purpose built secure online survey tool. It is important to note that we are not in any way "testing" your child. All responses to the survey are kept anonymous. Personal identification data will not be recorded in the survey response file. This ensures that the confidentiality of your child's responses is protected at all times.

YEAR 6-7 TRANSITION

Starting secondary school is one of the biggest steps in your child's life. As there are a variety of options for your child's secondary education, choose a school to suit your child's needs. You may want to make a list of things that are important to you and your child or visit the schools you are interested in; they welcome enquiries and will organise a time to visit.

An important step is to involve your child in deciding which secondary school they will attend. The following questions may assist you as you consider which secondary school will best benefit your child:

- Will the school cater for your child's needs and interests?
- How does the school support children with additional needs?
- How important is it that your child knows other children at the school?
- Does your family have a connection to a particular school?
- Do you have older children already attending a secondary school?

SMILE SQUAD

We are pleased to announce that Selby Primary School has been selected as the first school in the Dandenong Ranges to participate in the Victorian Government's school dental program – 'Smile Squad' – which provides free annual oral health examinations and free follow up care for all children attending Victorian government schools.

The Smile Squad program delivers on a Victorian Government commitment to improve the dental health of all Victorian



government primary, secondary and special school students. Smile Squad is the Victorian Government's only school dental program, offering free care from initial examinations to all treatment, excluding cosmetic dentistry. The Department of Health and the Department of Education and Training are working closely with Dental Health Services Victoria to design and deliver this program across the state.

Packs which included the consent forms were sent out last Thursday and must be filled in to allow your child to be seen. The service will be arriving at the school on Monday May 17 so forms are required to be returned prior to this time.


