

Attendance

It is a legal requirement that all students attend school on a daily basis. If you don't have any particular concerns, you might wonder whether it's worth going to parent-teacher interviews. But going along is one way to show your child that you're interested in their learning and what's happening for them at school.

Of course, if you do have concerns, it's a chance for you to raise them with your child's teacher if you haven't done that already.

NAPLAN 2023

NAPLAN is a national literacy and numeracy assessment that students in Years 3, 5, 7 and 9 sit each year. It is the only national assessment all Australian students have the opportunity to undertake.

As students progress through their school years, it's important to check how well they are learning the essential skills of reading, writing and numeracy. NAPLAN assesses the literacy and numeracy skills that students are learning through the school curriculum and allows parents/carers to see how their child is progressing against national standards and over time.

NAPLAN is just one aspect of a school's assessment and reporting process. It doesn't replace ongoing assessments made by teachers about student performance, but it can provide teachers with additional information about students' educational progress.

NAPLAN also provides schools, education authorities and governments with information about how education programs are working and whether young Australians are achieving important educational outcomes in literacy and numeracy.

The NAPLAN test window starts on Wednesday 15 March and finishes on Monday 27 March 2023.

We're a Compass School!

Compass is a school management solution that allows parents and carers to access up-to-date and meaningful information about your school and your child's progress. Compass includes many different features, including the ability to:

- Monitor your child's attendance, and enter an explanation for absence or lateness
- Update your family contact details
- Keep up to date with school news
- View your child's timetable and the school calendar
- Download and view your child's academic reports
- Book parent-teacher conferences
- Pay and provide consent for events and school fees

Tutoring Program

Who is offered Tutoring?

This year we will be opening up tutoring support to all students. Students may be chosen because they are:

- below the expected level and would benefit from tutoring support on a particular skill
- at the expected level but still have skills to work on
- above the expected level and in need of extension in a particular area.



How can we work together?

After some formative assessment, goals will be created in collaboration with the student, Jo and their classroom teacher. These goals will then be distributed home

How do students get chosen?

In 2023, Staff at Selby will be spending some of their planning time in PLC's (Professional Learning Communities). During these meetings, Staff look at recent assessment data to identify groups of students who could improve student outcomes. This data will inform teaching in the classroom and will dictate groups for the Tutoring Program. A letter will then be sent out to parents..

What does it look like?

Small groups of up to 5 students, working on the same goal. Students are taken out of the classroom for 30 minute sessions to practise a skill. The sessions will continue for 5 weeks (1 cycle).

ONLINE ORDERING Your child's school photos are now available for secure online purchase, please note if you are ordering online, you do not need to return an envelope to the school

4 EASY STEPS TO ONLINE SCHOOL PHOTO ORDERING

- Step 1 Click Here. For online ordering process for your school.
- OR Go to www.advancedlife.com.au before photo day and enter your school code [M8B AH3 TRN]
- Step 2: Enter your student's details
- Step 3: Choose the package that best suits your needs (all orders will be returned to the school for collection)
- Step 4: Pay for the photos via the shopping cart (upper right corner of the page)
- **Online Orders have a 1.5% merchant fee applied when using Visa, Mastercard or PayPal.

Please Note: If you miss photo day, portrait and group packages can still be ordered online for 7 days afterwards with no late fees. After that time, late orders will require separate processing and handling and therefore will incur a \$15 late fee per package.
