Parents / Caregivers/ Guardians Opinion Survey

If your family have not yet paid your Parent Payment for 2023 to support teaching and learning at Selby Primary School, we would ask that you make this financial contribution as soon as possible. Our staff are working incredibly hard to maximise student (and teacher) learning while also improving our classroom learning spaces and other school facilities. Our School fees equate to \$2.10 per day at school.





o Focus group attendees will be reimbursed with a \$40 Coles or Woolworths voucher for their time.




