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## **Principals Report**

The school holidays flew by and we are already at the tail end of Week 2 Term 4! Term 4 has started smoothly with all students enjoying their swimming program over the past two weeks. This term is already shaping into a very busy time at Selby with lots of fun and exciting learning adventures planned.

Our Prep 2024 Transition and Orientation Program commenced today with the first meet and greet session. Please ensure if you have a child beginning Prep next year, that you grab an enrolment form from the office to confirm your child's placement in Prep.

### Japanese Day

A reminder that this Friday is Japanese day and all students are encouraged to dress in Japanese-inspired costumes. We will be having a fashion parade at 9.30 am in the hall. Parents are welcome to attend.

### **Staffing updates**

I would like to welcome back Alex from maternity leave. Alex will be working on Wednesday and will focus on supporting students in various classrooms.

### School Improvements Buildings and Grounds Update

As a school and school council, we continue the careful upkeep of our school, ensuring our buildings and grounds are maintained to a high level for our students. There have been several building and grounds updates over these past weeks, including:

- New landscaping at the front of the school. Including plantings and replacements of the timber edging with mudstone boulders
- Wiamea Grove retaining wall has stalled as we await soil testing results. These have now been completed and we should see the project start up again soon. The new end date is the start of December.
- Replacement of the lower section of the playground is scheduled for 15th November so we will hopefully have the new playground installed and ready for use by the end of the year.

### Hats are back

Summer must be around the corner, because it's that time of year when we ask students to wear their SunSmart hats from Term 4 to the end of Term 1, aper our <u>SunSmart Policy</u>.

### **Bushfire Preparedness**

Selby Primary School is classified as a Category 2 School – considered to be at very high risk from bushfire.

Category 2 schools relocate or close in accordance with their preapproved plan on a day forecast Extreme FDR for their **Local Government Area (not Fire District)** The public can now access the fire rating for LGA's- <u>https://www.cfa.vic.gov.au/warnings-restrictions/total-fire-bansfire-danger-ratings/central-fire-district</u>

As per current arrangements, all schools on the BARR (Category 1-3) and Category 4 list, regardless of risk category, must close on a forecast Catastrophic FDR day under the AFDRS in their weather district. All other buses which travel through the Catastrophic FDR area will also be cancelled.

### Specific Arrangements for Selby Primary School

Where possible, we will provide parents with as much notice as possible of a potential Extreme or Catastrophic day closure through our Compass Portal. In the event of an Extreme Fire Day, the school will relocate to

#### <u>Habitat</u>



She has a love of eating things and reading books.


#### <u>Behavior</u>


Eva lives in Melbourne. Eva lives most of the day in her room. She loves her bed which is her natural habitat.


#### FOOD


