NAPLAN results

Last Monday we received this year's NAPLAN results. Results were distributed last week for students in Years 3 and 5. The results this year continue to show that the work we are doing across all year levels to improve Literacy and Numeracy is paying dividends with improved student outcomes.

Some of the highlights

Year 5 Results

Reading - 10% above the like schools result and was 18% above other schools in our network.

Writing - 100% of Students in the top two bands. 19% above like schools and 26% above other schools in our network.

Numeracy - 7% above the like schools and 13% above other schools in our network.

Year 3 Results

Reading – above the like schools result and was 8% above other schools in our network.

Writing – above the like schools result and 9% above other schools in our network.

Grammar and Punctuation – above the like schools results and 11% above other schools in our network.
























YEAR 1/2 NEWS

A very big thank you to Ana, Rick, Göknur and Gari for sharing your experiences and knowledge in your field of science with the 1/2s, you were inspirational!




















PHYS ED NEWS

Purple tastes like the delicious hubba bubba and grapes.



RESOURCE SMART SCHOOLS

We are very excited that Selby Primary School has been awarded our 1st ResourceSmart School star! Over the last 12-18 months we have developed a sustainability plan, planted shrubs, reintroduced nude food lunches, removed lamination from the Good Book Awards, fixed leaking pipes and taps, replaced gas appliances with electrical and fitted energy efficient light bulbs plus much more.

The school has saved over \$11,000 by reducing water, energy and waste. We have reduced carbon emissions equal to removing 14 petrol cars off the road every year and saved enough electricity to power 3 houses each year.

We are looking forward to progressing through the biodiversity, waste, water and energy modules on our way to becoming a 5 star ResourceSmart School.
