This term, we have spent lots of time exploring Scratch and how to code. The Year 1/2s have had a wonderful time coding their own narrative to share with the class.














The 3/4s have been working hard to finish off two major projects. Our Inquiry Alien Life project and our Debate Challenge! Please enjoy some photos below...











































Survival needs


