FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE

INFORMATION FOR PARENTS

Every Victorian child should have access to the world of learning opportunities that exist beyond the classroom. The Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund helps ensure that no student will miss out on the opportunity to join their classmates for important, educational and fun activities. It is part of making Victoria the Education State and the Government's commitment to breaking the link between a student's background and their outcomes.

CAMPS, SPORTS & EXCURSIONS FUND (CSEF)

School camps provide children with inspiring experiences in the great outdoors. Excursions encourage a deeper understanding of how the world works while sports teach teamwork, discipline and leadership. All are a part of a healthy curriculum.

CSEF is provided by the Victorian Government to assist eligible families to cover the costs of school trips, camps and sporting activities.

If you hold a valid means-tested concession card or are a temporary foster parent, you may be eligible for CSEF. A special consideration category also exists for asylum seeker and refugee families. The allowance is paid to the school to use towards expenses relating to camps, excursions or sporting activities for the benefit of your child.

The annual CSEF amount per student is:

- · \$154 for primary school students
- · \$256 for secondary school students

HOW TO APPLY

New applicants should contact the school office to obtain a CSEF application form or download from the website below.

If you applied for CSEF at your child's school last year, you do not need to complete an application form this year unless there has been a change in your family circumstances.

You only need to complete an application form if any of the following changes have occurred:

- new student enrolments: your child has started or changed schools this year.
- changed family circumstances: such as a change of custody, change of name, concession card number, or new siblings commencing this year.

Check with the school office if you are unsure


























Have you heard about values tokens? Have you heard about Pom Poms? Have you heard about a whole school reward?

At Selby Primary School we are proud to have a whole school positive approach to the behaviour and wellbeing of our students.

All staff and the student leadership team have enjoyed acknowledging students when they demonstrate our school values of: Personal Best, Resilience, Confidence and Respect.

Students are acknowledged both inside and outside the classroom with a values token which they add to their individual chart displayed in their classroom. When they receive 10 acknowledgements, they receive a pom pom, certificate and a individual reward. The individual rewards are made up of tangible objects and non tangible rewards. They get to take the pom pom up to the office and choose a whole school reward of their choice by placing it in one of the values carriages. The rewards are chosen by our students through their nominated Student Voice Team representative. Student working together to achieve a whole school goal. This week students are working on "walking respectfully in the hallways".

We are proud to be recognised for successfully implementing and embedding the SWPBS approach into our school environment. With two Gold Awards for our level of implementation.










My name is Andrea Jackson and, as part of the Mental Health in Primary Schools (MHiPS) initiative, I have been employed as the Mental Health and Wellbeing Leader (MHWL) at Selby PS. My role includes promoting a strong sense of wellbeing and supporting positive mental health in the school community. I will be working with staff, students, families and external providers to enhance the existing wellbeing already embedded at Selby PS, strengthen community connections, and provide clear pathways of referral for those requiring extra support.... but it is not a counselling service. I am also focusing on maximising student engagement, fostering positive relationships and encouraging flourishing learning environments. The MHiPS initiative is a product of Victoria's Royal Commission into Mental Health. The program began in 2020, is being rolled out this year in our region, and by next year, most Victorian primary schools will have a Mental Health & Wellbeing Leader. I'm at Selby on Mondays, Thursdays and Fridays and you might see me on yard duty before or after school or hear that I've been working in your child's classroom. Please come up and say hello



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Dear School Community,

Notice of Stock Shortages Due to School Saving Bonus / Online Order Delays

We hope you all had a lovely holiday over the summer break.

We're reaching out with an inventory update, as we're aware that some families were unable to purchase items that they wanted when visiting our retail stores over the holiday break. Unfortunately due to limitations on how much inventory each store can hold, we did have periods where we temporarily ran out of specific items and sizes. We did try to limit this as much as possible with frequent deliveries to each store throughout the School holiday period, but unfortunately that didn't prevent this from occurring.

We've also found that some of our Beleza basics range of non-logo'd have sold quicker due to more families purchasing them alongside their logo'd items, as well as schools that we don't supply for nominating us as a supplier under the School Saving Bonus program. Unfortunately we only became aware of this when transactions occur because we don't have visibility on student/school information until then. As a result, some of these gaps have impacted both our government and non-government schools as well.

For customers who were unable to purchase what they needed in-store on the day, we strongly recommend speaking with our in-store team to leave your details so that they can set aside these items for you and contact you once they're available. If you did not place an order at the time of your visit, we encourage you to reach out to your local Beleza store team to arrange one.

We will have frequent deliveries to our stores in the coming weeks, and will also be receiving shipments from overseas production for items that we no longer have available in our warehouse. We're working hard to fulfil all customer orders, as well as identifying and filling any low- or no-stock items across our stores.

We are also still actively working to dispatch as many online orders as possible, however we are still working through the significant influx of orders that came through immediately when the School Saving Bonus rolled out to families. At this stage, we are approximately 3-4 weeks behind in processing online orders.

As a reminder, Uniform purchases with Beleza using the School Saving Bonus are still active until end of June.

We would like to apologise for any inconvenience caused by these shortages and processing delays, and thank you for your patience and understanding as we navigate the increased demand from the School Saving Bonus.
