


What an incredible week of Sport we had last week!






We have been trialling the URSTRONG Friendology program which is a whole-school strategy that empowers children with friendship skills to create cultures of kindness in schools. It teaches children how to make friends, be a good friend, and learn the difference between healthy and unhealthy friendships. The Junior School and 3/4s have completed the program and the 5/6s have a couple of lessons to go. All students have learned about the '4 Friendship Facts', the 'Friend-O-Meter' and the 'Friend-O-Cycle'. Students in the Upper School have also learned how to identify and respond to 'Mean On Purpose' behaviour.




